Transport: Fish will be distributed in cold water, oxygenated bags. It is recommended that you acclimate the fish to the pond water. This is done gradually over 1 to 2 hours by adding pond water to the bag/container.

Pick up fish at the SWCD office at 50 Commerce Way, behind the East Aurora Post Office on Route 20A at the western edge of the Village of East Aurora.
